It was reported at the last management meeting that we had made approximately £5,000 in plant sales since 1st May this year, which is good going for us. Thanks are due to the sales team on site and to those who run the sales around York.

Preparation for Winter

Brian Horsley and Davie Shannon have spent many hours working through the greenhouses cleaning the very dirty glass, many thanks for this you are doing a great job. Gradually we have been putting the nursery to bed for the winter, moving the tender plants into the protection of the pit house, the next job is to put all the bubble insulation back in place and prepare the paraffin heaters and boiler in readiness for the seed sowing next January. The seeds have been bought and are ready to go when the time is right. Tony Nunn has been working on the many list of plants which members wanted to grow, and finally selected the ones we can afford. The order has gone in for all 2013 plants so that we get the early order discount.

St Nicholas Fields

St Nic's have become corporate members of the nursery and are keep to work in partnership with us particularly in developing a good composting system. Also developing a sales and display area on the coal drop site.
